COPE

Cost of Poverty Experience



As JFO continues to expand, we are focusing in 2023 on adding trainings related to the complexities of child wellbeing to our work. We currently have trainings on FASD, Poverty, Trauma and COPE. We have had two Cost of Proverty Experiences so far this year and both were a hit with the participants!

COPE is a 2.5 hour immersive role-play that allows participants a glimpse into the daily decision making process of those living in poverty as well as a debrief time that encompasses discussions on community limitations, access to resources, language limitations and other factors that can leave a family struggling to escape poverty. The debrief is also tailored to the participants and how their new, deeper understanding will change the way they work or volunteer.

We have been blessed to partner with SEAT Center in Schenectady. The young adults who are enrolled in this workforce development program serve as the community resource leaders. Their willingness to roleplay allows the participants to completely enter the experience as well.



Our first COPE was a community one with lots of different agencies, churches, and businesses represented. Our second one was hosted by Siena College and consisted of students from their pyschology, social work and history departments along with a few professors. Both groups expressed a deeper understanding of the world of poverty and it enhanced their compassion and their determination to help solve this problems related to poverty.

Doris from our community event said "Collectively, I have attended more than 100 trainings at the national, state and local levels in my roles as a Program Director for a community center, a preschool teacher and Education Coordinator for Head Start as well as an Early Childhood Supervisor and Statewide Training Coordinator with the NYS Education Dept.
